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The itinerary will start from Piazza Maggiore, the heart of the city, dominated by medieval palaces: Palazzo di Re Enzo, which takes its name from the captivity of Enzo, king of Sardinia and son of the Emperor Frederick II of Swabia (XIII century); Palazzo Comunale (City Hall), Palazzo del Podestà (XIII century), the Town's Court, rebuilt by Bentivoglio family, the city's Lords during the XV century; Palazzo of the Notaries, seat of one of the most powerful guilds in the Middle Ages. Palazzo dei Banchi, the money changers' seat (XVI century). In the square is also the Fountain of Neptune, with the precious late Renaissance sculptures by Giambologna; we will visit the gothic Basilica of San Petronio (on the façade, sculptures by Jacopo della Quercia from Siena). Inside: precious late gothic paintings of the Cappella Bologni and the sun-dial designed by the astronomer Cassini (XVII century). Walking along the Pavaglione Portico and its elegant shops, we reach the Archiginnasio Palace (XVI century), the old University building, decorated with about 6.000 coats of arms of students. Through the picturesque alleys of the old market, named Mercato di Mezzo, and its fabulous food shops, we reach the lovely Square of Santo Stefano, with the complex of Santo Stefano also called the "Jerusalem of Bologna" or "The Seven Churches", a group of small Romanesque churches. Then iazza della Mercanzia, with the gothic Palazzo della Mercanzia and some buildings with wooden porticoes (XIII century). The visit will end at the foot of the Two Towers, the symbol of the city.
