• General statement: "The diagnosis and management of acute Kawasaki disease patients rests on classical clinical symptoms, often incomplete, occasionally atypical, with the support of basic biological tests. There is no formal training in Kawasaki disease, however. There is expertise that comes with exposure to a vast variety of cases. This didactic session aims to expose the learner to five clinical scenarios, discuss them with experts, and revert with impactful take home messages".
